


## **Feline Adoption Application**

Thank you for your interest in adopting from Peace Ridge Sanctuary. We are happy that you have chosen to help us rescue animals. In our adoption contract, which you will need to review, along with this application, you will see that we are very specific about quality of care and we also insist that if you are no longer able to keep the cat or kitten, you must return him or her promptly to us here at Peace Ridge Sanctuary.

The adoption fee is \$100.00 for cats and kittens already spayed and neutered. For kittens who are too young to spay/neuter you will schedule the appointment with your own vet and make a deposit of \$150.00 which is returnable to you once the animal is spayed and neutered per your appointment. To retrieve your deposit, we will just need proof of the spay/neuter- a copy of your veterinarian's surgery certificate will do. We cannot adopt out animals who are too young to spay/neuter unless we are guaranteed that they will be done by the age of 6 months by the adopter. If you would like assistance scheduling the procedure, please specify that below and we may be able to give you an alternative arrangement.


